2005 AIRUM Conference



Elevating the Value of Institutional Research in Higher Education

The 2005 AIRUM conference will be held on November 10-11, 2005 at Hotel Sofitel in Bloomington, Minnesota.

Keynote speakers will include Victor Borden, immediate past president of the Association for Institutional Research (AIR) and Karen Solomon from the Higher Learning Commission.

ictor Borden, the Thursday keynote speaker, will address "elevating the role of institutional research in higher education."



Dr. Victor Borden is Associate Vice President for University Planning, Institutional Research and Accountability for Indiana University. He is also an associate professor for IUPUI's Psychology Department (Purdue School of Science) and has adjunct

appointments in the department of Educational Leadership and Policy Studies (Indiana University School of Education), the Indiana University School of Informatics, and IUPUI's University College (IUPUI). Dr. Borden' primary research interests are in the areas of student progress and performance and institutional and program performance indicators.

Dr. Borden has published over 50 articles and book chapters, including the annual analysis of degrees conferred to students of color for Black Issues in Higher Education. His professional activities include consulting and teaching workshops on accountability and improvement, program assessment, statistics, survey research, and the use of technology for assessment, decision support, and institutional analysis. He has delivered more than 150 presentations and workshops throughout the U.S. and in Europe and Asia.



aren J. Solomon, will address the different conversations that involve student learning— "Who Hears You? Conversations Considered" What could those conversations entail? How do you convey the outcomes so they are understandable to your internal and external

communities? What information is needed for your president, students, alumni, and other different populations? What is the role of Institutional Research in understanding and supporting those conversations? The Higher Learning Commission's new criteria focus on student learning, and institutions are beginning to understand the differences in the revised criteria. How can we help to tell the story?

Karen J. Solomon joined the staff of the Higher Learning Commission in August of 2003. As Assistant Director for Accreditation Services, she serves as the Commission's liaison to approximately 200 institutions involved in PEAQ. Solomon came to the Commission from Northern Illinois University where she was Coordinator of Research and Evaluation in Adult Continuing Education. Before her work at NIU, she was an Education Associate in Outcomes Assessment for ACT, Inc. (American College Testing). Solomon has also served as Executive Director for Illinois Campus Compact for Community Service, and at Benedictine University (IL) as Associate Dean of Student Development for Co-curricular Activities, and other positions. She has teaching experience at NIU and Benedictine. Solomon has delivered many national presentations on outcomes assessment, evaluation service learning, and student development, and has served as a paid consultant on assessment and adult learning. She holds a B.A degree in Business from North Central College (IL), an M.B.A from Benedictine University (IL), and an Ed. D. in Adult and Continuing Education from Northern Illinois University.
