Our meeting theme this year is focused on the pathways from institutional research (IR) to institutional effectiveness (IE), in light of that we are very pleased to announce that a national leader in this area of higher education, Dr. William E. Knight, will be joining us at our annual meeting in 2014. Dr. Knight will be providing a keynote addressing the future of IR and IE and will also provide a full-day pre-conference workshop on developing leadership skills in IR and IE. He is currently the Assistant Provost for Institutional Effectiveness and an adjunct faculty member at Ball State University. He is a founding member of the Association for Higher Education Effectiveness (<http://www.ahee.org/>) and past president, past forum chair and a past member of the Board of Directors of the Association for Institutional Research.

And in a first for our annual meeting we are pleased to announce a second pre-conference workshop will be available. Dr. Leonard Goldfine from the Office of Institutional Research at the University of Minnesota and affiliated faculty member with the Organizational Leadership and Policy Development department will provide a full-day pre-conference workshop focused on understanding the nature, limits, and ambiguity of what data can (and cannot) tell you, especially in such hot-topic policy arenas as dashboards, rankings, and equity analysis.



HOTEL INFORMATION AND LOCATION:

The 2014 AIRUM conference will be held again at the Hilton Minneapolis-St. Paul Airport/Mall of America (3800 American Blvd E, Bloomington, Minnesota, 55425, USA). Located in lovely Bloomington, the hotel is next to the Minnesota Valley National Wildlife Refuge featuring a complete Visitor Center and over 8 miles of walking/jogging trails through the beautiful MN River Valley. The hotel is one mile from the Mall of America and three miles from the Minneapolis St. Paul International airports; both of which are accessible via light rail just blocks from the hotel.

RESOURCES	<i>Via the use of institutional data, we can provide guidance in the development of resources, such as; faculty, staff, facilities and programs on campus. How are you shaping that process?</i>
STUDENTS	<i>What effective actions have you taken in your work to further engage in evolving campus decisions about student matriculation, retention, student profile, and the experiences of enrolled students?</i>
TECHNOLOGY MANAGEMENT	<i>Data management and analysis is rapidly evolving with new tools. What steps are you taking? Effective leadership of IR on campus means internal operations and staffing are in order. What can we learn about how it's evolving for your department?</i>

2013 AIRUM Conference Feedback

The Fall 2013 AIRUM conference was evaluated through the use of both an overall conference evaluation and individual program evaluations. For the 2nd year, the AIRUM Steering Committee used a hybrid online and paper process for conference evaluations. Participants were encouraged to use the link posted at the AIRUM website to submit online evaluations using Qualtrics software. The link would allow program evaluations to be sent either through laptops or mobile devices. Alternatively, conference attendees could print off the paper evaluations, complete them at the conference, and enter the information directly into Qualtrics after the conference. Using this hybrid approach has served to save paper and simplify the data entry process. But many presenters have been concerned about not getting a large number of responses back – most sessions received evaluations from about 25% of attendees. Additionally, the administrative process for analyzing results, creating individual reports, and sending them out after the conference takes quite a bit more time than it would take to simply use carbon copy paper forms and leave a copy with the presenters. For the size of our conference, the committee is considering what evaluation methods best help us reach our goals for an effective, thorough and efficient evaluation process.

Key findings from the conference showed that attendees were most pleased with the location, hotel, pre-conference workshop, and costs. Using this information, the committee will be seeking to keep costs the same, keeping the program book, and checking for availability with the same hotel. See the scores below:

There were no categories of the conference that scored below a 3.91 on the scale, but the lowest score occurred in response to "Satisfaction with Alternative Session Formats." There were comments questioning whether we should continue to offer a Poster session with very few presenters participating. The committee would like to continue offering Poster sessions, as it's a good way to involve graduate students, but will seek ways to increase participation to make it function better as part of the program. Although "Quality of Food" scored fairly high on the quantitative evaluation (4.11) with many positive comments, there were specific remarks about breakfast quality that the committee will use to make improvements next year, ideally expanding breakfast options while still staying within the desirable pricing structure participants seek.

Additionally, there were comments that the keynote felt repetitive to the pre-conference workshop, and so the committee is seeking to insure that different content is presented in the two venues. There were several ideas presented for keynote speakers and pre-conference workshops, and the committee decided to pursue an "Institutional Effectiveness" theme in 2014. This was a suggestion made on multiple evaluations, and the committee thought it would offer an interesting contrast to the statistical themes presented at the 2012 and 2013 AIRUM pre-conference workshops.

Finally, the overall feedback showed that AIRUM participants enjoy the annual conference, seeing it as an excellent value and good networking opportunity, and praising it for being well-organized and offering a diverse array of high quality and relevant programs.
